Pastor's Corner

“Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means Teacher).”

-- John 20:16 (NIV)

Most of us are familiar with John’s account of Jesus’ resurrection. We know that our faith depends on a Savior who was crucified and then defeated death, rose again, and now lives forever as our friend, advocate, and guide. In the scripture reference listed above we read the first thing he said after his resurrection, only one word, the name, “Mary!”

Our names are important to us. We all listen when our names are mentioned. We identify with our name. We relate to others by our name. To some degree our names define who we are. Can you imagine then what must have been going through Mary’s mind when this “gardener” called her by name? Immediately her whole outlook changed. No longer was she searching for a dead friend. No longer did tears wrack her body in the face of death. At just that moment she entered into the intimacy of Jesus’ love. At once her mourning was changed into joy. Suddenly light and life banished darkness and despair. Her world that was turned upside down had been turned right side up again!

And you know something friends, that is what the presence of Jesus in our lives can do for us as well! Jesus knows our names. We are special to him. He loves us. He desires a relationship with us, just like one we would have with our closest friend. And that relationship and closeness can make all the difference in our lives just like it did in Mary’s. Imagine the hope and love that were in her heart after she saw the risen Lord! Without a doubt, all the problems and concerns in her life were overshadowed by the hope and fulfillment she felt that day. And her hope continued, because she knew Jesus would continue to be there and she would see him often.

Jesus’ resurrection did not just guarantee us life after death, it gave us a living friend, a confidant, a guide, and a helper for every day of our lives. That’s why I want to challenge you this Easter, to desire a closer relationship with the living Christ, to cultivate a daily relationship that is not confined to a few prayers before we go to work in the morning or a few verses of Scripture before we go to bed at night. Because when we work on our relationship with Jesus – and it is work, as we are often distracted by our daily tasks, worries, or self-concerns – Christ becomes a wonderful source of love, assurance, and blessing, to us and to others as he works in us and through us to his good pleasure.

The Adult Sunday School Class

has big plans for the rest of this school year and you are invited!

Beginning Sunday March 3rd the class will start a 4-part Easter Lenten Series titled, "The Easter Experience" by Jason Turner. There is no doubt, that life can be a roller coaster of experiences and emotions. The Gospel of Luke shares with us the emotions, of two wondering disciples who felt disappointed in what they had seen and witnessed as news travels from the empty tomb to them as the head from Jerusalem to Emmaus. The two disciples have an encounter with Jesus, that is not only life changing, but leaves them understanding that no matter what life brings us, Jesus is always right beside us.

Then starting on Easter Sunday, March 31st the class will finish out the school year with a study on the Book of First Timothy titled, "Wisdom from Generation to Generation." Special thanks to RN Linda Holt (front R) who stepped up as Team Leader when Ash's health precluded my going with any peace. Longtime friends texted daily pictures so I could be part of the team from home and then write this newsletter. Needless to say, I had happy and sad tears to fall every day but loved seeing them use their medical, nursing and therapy gifts alongside 2 churches, *Iglesia Renacer* (Be Reborn) and *Iglesia Vida Cristiana* (Christian Life).

Church-planting pastors Daniel Osorio (wife Indira) and Noé Contreras (wife Ester) under the mentorship of MTW's Gabriel Diaz and Scott Craig, had diligently prepared since May to bless their communities with these *brigadas medicas*. Our clinics are always *gratis*, and this amazing-to-patients fact leads easily into conversations with them about the free grace of Christ!

Returning clinician Autumn Fair brought her new portable sonography machine to assist team doctors in their diagnoses and to bless pregnant women.



"There's nothing like showing mamas their growing babies!" Autumn said. Her patients certainly agree!



Non-clinical servant, retired teacher Susan Service, was a key team member. Suz has been *oculista* on many medical teams, fitting older patients with reading glasses which are so necessary in many of their jobs, not just vital for reading. Prayer, as with Susan here, happened at every clinic station, praise God!



Armando is an amputee of 4 years. He lost his hand in a work-related machine accident and then his job, and there is no such thing as *Workman's Comp* for him. Armando had come to clinic because of high BP. Triage RN Stella Sosuh asked if he would also like to be fitted for a prosthesis.

When he first met OT Cornelia Benson, he asked, "How much does it cost? I'm a poor man, and I've no money."



Cornelia answered, "Nothing! We're here to share the love of Jesus and help with physical and spiritual wounds."

Armando queried, "What kind of God do you serve that you'd come from the U.S. to the slums of our mountains and offer me an artificial limb that I'd never hope to own?!"

"A mighty and loving God!" Cornelia replied. "In my church our pastor says, 'It's for YOU Christ came,, for YOU He died... and for YOU He will come again!' "

What a Holy Moment for the team, knowing that Jehovah Roi had seen Armando long before Cornelia prayed over the prosthesis before its packing, asking God to bring to clinic the one who would need it. Praise-God, from Whom all blessings flow!

Please pray with us that Armando will come to know the full grace of Christ.





Lawyer Ron Kerr accompanied his wife Wendy for his first time. Pediatrician Wendy has



ministered on my assigned teams and those of others for years. Lovingly dubbed "El Jefe" (The Boss) by his teammates, Ron managed clinic flow of patients to various stations and demonstrated a cheerful, do-anything servant heart.

Two "next gen" missionaries graced the team to bless patients. High school senior Abbey Coch, planning to go into nursing, and PT Lucy Estock were also first-timers to medical-evangelism. Whether in pharmacy or welcoming patients with her RN mother Jill in Triage, Abbey was an eager learner.

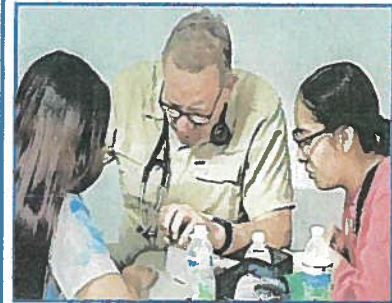


Lucy told me over coffee post-mission that she remembers hearing me speak in church when she was 8. I had shared how we need more PT servants. Already pondering physical therapy as a career, Lucy said that convinced her. Wow, glory to God! She and NP Wemi Olagbaju cared for Carmen, a widow with an ankle fracture. She had many emotional needs, too, as her pastor-husband had been killed by a gang member.



Lucy and Wemi provided listening ears, prayers, hugs and instruction on using new crutches which will help Carmen navigate her home, as a borrowed wheelchair is too big for the doorways.

Marta's story is equally impactful. With the help of Scott and Cornelia, Lucy configured a walker to get Marta out of a wheelchair to be upright and more self-mobile despite her foot and hand limitations. Praise God!



Family Medicine MD Walt Novikoff returned a second year to share Jesus and his gifts in Mexico. Besides loving his patients, Walt played guitar and led the team's morning devotions with thoughtfully chosen songs.

Finally, what a huge privilege (and a real necessity) to have national physicians on teams. They lend specific, regional clinical expertise and can care for those needing follow-up after we leave.

Our sister-in-Christ Karen Martinez was that blessing to the team and to the communities as she treated and prayed over each of her patients.



Praise God for... this beautiful Saltillo bi-cultural team that He ordained & a gospel ministry which He directed through them ...the global body of Christ as 'street lamps', 'scaffolding', and the 'arms' of Aaron & Hur in Ash's and my new-normal ...your prayer & financial partnerships in our calling to medical-evangelism—for 18 years now!

Please pray for... effective follow-up with patients by the Saltillo churches ...plans made for Ash's care so I might serve in Trinidad next January ...team unity even now as 14, possibly 16, of us prepare to share Jesus through caring for dear Trinidadians.
