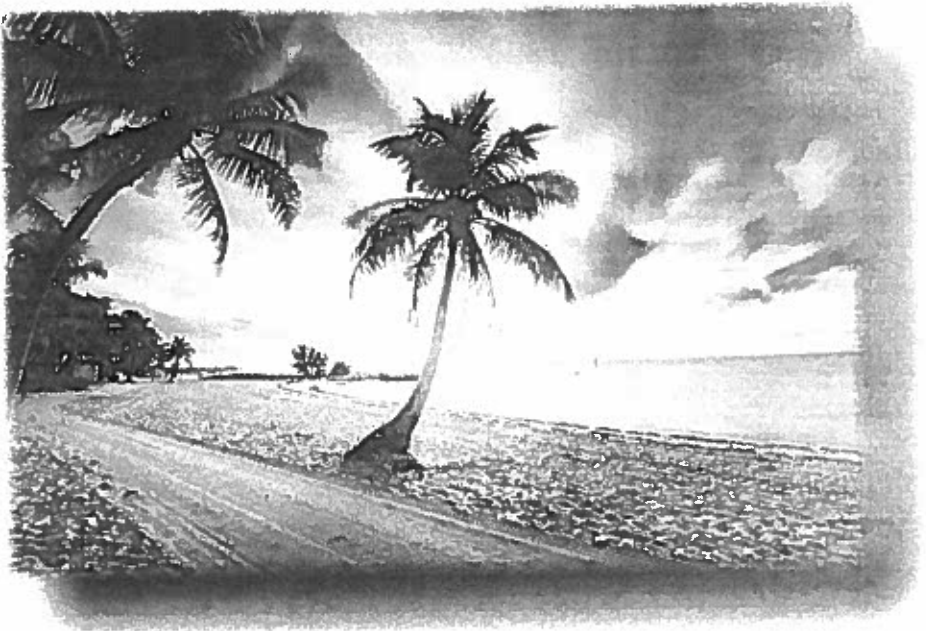

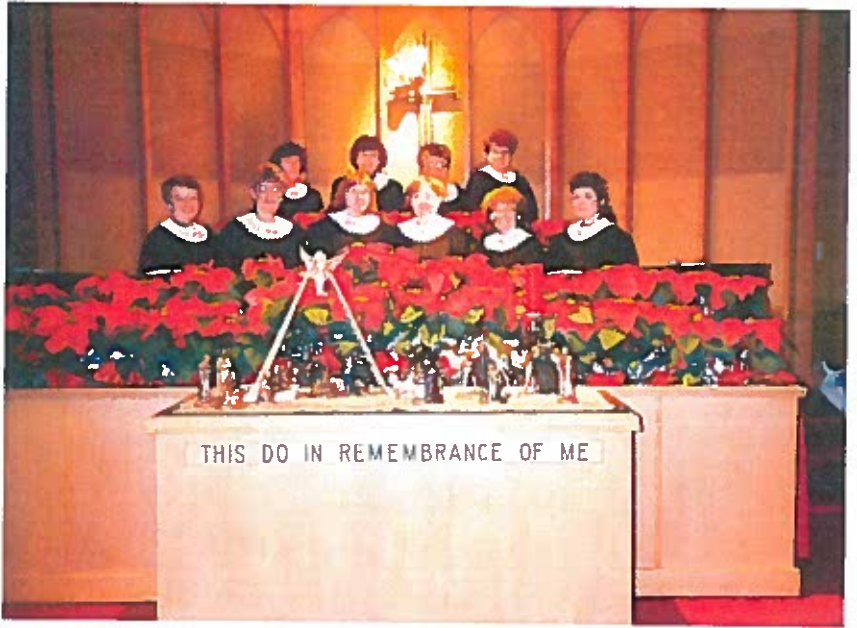
Qadosh Bells

Celebrating 30+ Years of Ringing

Praises to our Lord

June 2, 2019





Qadosh is a Hebrew word meaning “Holy, set apart for God.” The Qadosh Bells were formed in 1988, when a two-octave set of handbells were purchased in memory of Mr. and Mrs. Kermit Larson. In 2002, an extra half-octave of higher bells were bought to enable the group to play three-octave music. Also that year, with funds in memory of Vivian Barrett, a set of handchimes were obtained which could be used alone or in conjunction with the handbells. In the early 1990's, a teen group was formed and directed by both Karen Reinard and Jane Rohlin. The Qadosh Bells were directed by Karen Reinard until 1996 and by Christina McClellan since that time.

In addition to the handbells and handchimes, small colored bells were recently purchased to be used with the children during summer Day Camp, the Day Care Ministry, and during the Christmas and Easter parties. They have also been used at the Watson Home with the residents.

To hold all of this equipment, Albert Hoffman constructed a wooden cabinet, and Dave Clark built the individual music stands that are used each time we play for worship services.

Over the years, the Qadosh Bells have played in some local churches, nursing homes, weddings, and for the funeral of Sandy Neal, one of our original ringers.
