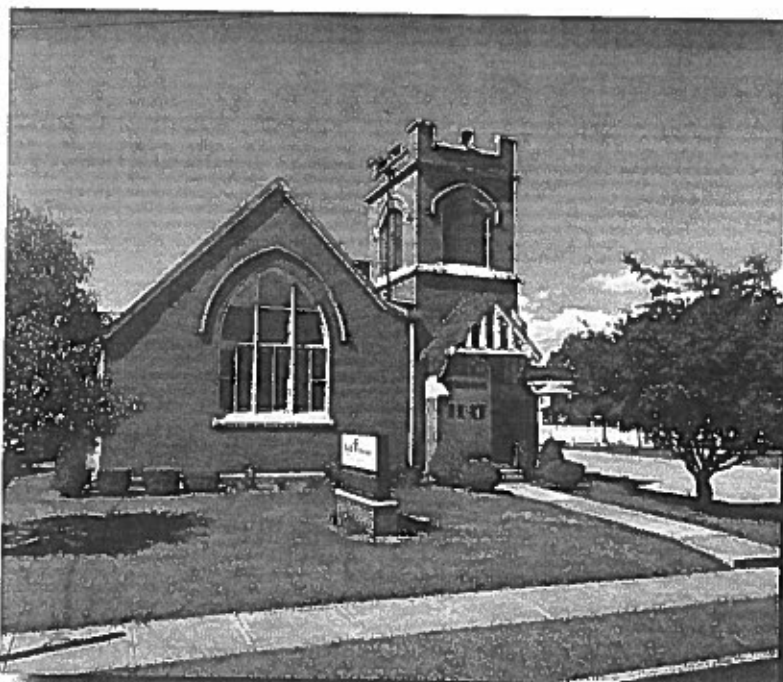

NON-PERISHABLE FOOD

- Beef jerky/sticks
- Snack crackers (peanut butter & cheese)
- Foil pouch foods (tuna, salmon, chicken with crackers)
- Pop Tarts, cereal cups
- Individual soup mixes & hot cereals
- Water enhancers – single serve
- Candy/gum/mints
- Ready-to-eat chili, pasta, soup in pouch/pop-top lid
- Dried fruit, fruit snacks, fruit rollups, raisins, trail mixes
- Five-hour Energy shots
- Peanut butter
- Honey sticks
- Protein, Power & Cliff Bars
- Ground or instant coffee packets, sugar, instant creamer
