Here are a few brief explanations of what the different ministry opportunities in our church involve. Everyone is encouraged to find an outlet for your God-given gifts in which you may serve God. If you have questions, please be sure to ask Buddy or one of the Worship Committee members.

Lay Leader - Assists in the leading of the worship service. All materials are furnished and you may abstain from any activity with which you do not feel comfortable.

Usher – Collects offering, greets all worship service attendees and provides them with worship bulletins. May also help seat anyone requesting assistance. Attend to candles, lights, etc. before and after the service, pick up after service.

Adult Nursery Worker - Supervises the nursery during the worship service. Men and couples are encouraged to accept this opportunity. This is truly an important position in a family church like ours.

**State law now requires that adult nursery workers obtain background clearances. Please provide copies for our files. If you have not already gotten yours, we will be happy to help you with that procedure at no cost to you.*

Youth Nursery Worker - Assists the Nursery Worker.

After Church Coffee Hosts - Serves coffee, tea, lemonade or similar beverages at after church social. Prepares and provides light “finger foods.”

Other - Singing, playing an instrument, lead singing, performing in a drama, etc. We also need help with clerical office work, help with the newsletter, website/computer work, fix-it chores, audio/video work, maintain bulletin boards, teach classes, Wednesday Youth Recreation etc.

CWS BLANKETS

Coming together to cover our neighbors

We can be our strongest, our kindest and our most Christ-like when we are connected. It makes the symbol of a CWS Blanket even more powerful: think of all the individual pieces of thread and wool being pulled together to cover someone with warmth! Without any one of those pieces - without you! - the story would not be the same.

That's what happened in Indianapolis last winter. The Midwest gets cold. You don't have to live on the streets to know that, but for those who do, the deep dives below zero are deadly.

Congregations like Central Christian Church (Indy CCC) in Indianapolis don't want to see their neighbors suffer. So they're doing something about it...and you're helping them. Last winter, this meant the church provided heavy-duty CWS Blankets for families without homes. It also meant they opened their doors each night to give people a comfortable place to sleep, safe from icy temperatures. CWS Blankets made bedding, a warm shelter and hope for life possible.

From you to CWS to groups like Indy CCC to strangers on the streets...we're working together to weave a story of human love and compassion. It's one where families are protected from the cold, comforted after a disaster and reminded that they're not alone.
