"But immediately He spoke to the disciples saying, 'Take heart, it is I; have no fear!" Matthew 14:27

Pastor's Fear is something all of us know something about, especially as we continue to Corner struggle with this seemingly never ending COVID-19 pandemic! Fear can work for us, making us aware of danger and keeping us safe. But more often than not, fear tends to be destructive, keeping us from doing the things we should be doing. It is not enough to tell ourselves not to be afraid. Rather, we need to get to the reason for our fear. And sometimes it is our ego or our desire to be in control-and not finding it-that causes that

fear. We find ourselves being threatened by some situation or by somebody. We become concerned about how we are going to satisfy the expectations of people or what we perceive to be the expectations of people. We think it all depends on us, and we leave little room for God.

So how do we deal with our fears? First, we need to find the root cause that is underneath our fear and seek ways to deal with it. It helps us to differentiate between legitimate and illegitimate anxiety or fear. Many of us are fearful of things that are not likely to happen or things that have already happened and cannot be changed.

Second, we need to confess our fears and tell God that we are afraid. Face our fears head on. Be open about it. Stop pretending. As a soldier once wrote to his father, "Dad, the difficulties of life decrease the moment they are faced."

Third, we need to ask God to help us and to heal us of our fear and to claim God's promises. At this point it is helpful to read scriptures like: Genesis 26:24 - "Fear not, for I am with you and will bless you;" Isaiah 41:10 - "Fear not, for I am with you, be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand;" Matthew 10:30 - "Even the hairs of your head are numbered. Fear not, therefore, you are of more value than many sparrows,"

We tend to focus on ourselves and what the government can do to help us, when our focus should be on Jesus. The disciples were fearful when, in Matthew 14, the waves beat upon the boat they were in. Their focus was on themselves. Jesus said, "Take heart, it is I; have no fear." When Peter came to Jesus walking on the water, he was fine as long as he kept his eyes upon Jesus. When he saw the wind and waves and took his eyes off the Lord, he became afraid, began to sink and cried out to Jesus for help. Jesus said, "O man of little faith, why did you doubt?"

The prophet in Isaiah 40:31 put it this way: "They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength. They shall mount up with wings as eagles." I visited a person once who had a sign in her kitchen that read: "God is bigger than any problem that I have." And you know something folks, that is a faith that can give us wings in the face of fear. So, "fear not," for Christ is with us, no matter what comes our way, and we can always trust in Him!






