"Our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ, who, by the Pastor's power that enables Him to bring everything under His Corner control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like His glorious body." Philippians 3:20-21

Our goal as Christians is to become like Christ. This transformation is a lifelong process. The Scriptures tell us that Christ will do this work in us, but we as individuals must cooperate with Him. We short-circuit the process by ignoring the goal and living for ourselves. This drive to live for ourselves is at the core of our nature, permeating our mind, our emotions and our will. We would prefer to avoid the process of transformation, live unto ourselves, and rationalize that we are sufficient and able to do most everything. We turn to God only in dire circumstances.

The Apostle Paul laments in verses 18 and 19 of Philippians chapter 3 over some who have accepted Christ, but have refused to cooperate with Him. Paul says of them that "their god is their belly." They sell their spiritual birthright for a mess of pottage. He says that they "glory in their shame." They justify themselves, and convince themselves of such unreality, that evil becomes good, and they rejoice in their delusion. He says that their minds are set on earthly things, and they lose their relationship to the living God. They are "enemies of the cross." They refuse to deny their natures, and to make the daily choices to cooperate with God as God seeks to change them. Their end is destruction.

Just as Jesus in the Gospel yearned to gather the people of Jerusalem under His protection, so He longs to help, heal, nurture, and protect His followers today. He likens His desire to care for us to that of a mother hen gathering her chicks under her wings in comfort and security. Not only did those in Jerusalem rebel and refuse to cooperate, but they wiped out those who challenged them, and did violence to any who would help them. So what about us, we who are called by the name of Christ today? Will we cooperate with our Lord as He seeks to transform us into His likeness, or will we choose to follow our own selfish nature against His? Lent is the season of inner change. So, let us take advantage of this opportunity and ask the Holy Spirit to transform us into the people that God made us to be!

(Personnel, Finance, Endowment, Investment)
Those of you that have looked over the
Church Budget for 2023, may have noticed
that we have a severe loss budgeted for the
year - \$23,133.38 to be exact. This is a rather
large deficit in relation to the total budget. It
comes from many reasons: loss of income,
loss of members, rising building operating
costs, and increasing labor costs (2.5%), just
to name a few. Fortunately, we were blessed
last year by those who gave special gifts to
help us meet last year's expenses; but the
question arises, "What about this year?"

I received a call from one a long-time member suggesting that maybe we should consider asking everyone to increase their giving by 10%, which would help address this deficit. And I'm grateful that God so frequently provides Ultrasound for both vital diagnostic aid and to show mothers their unborn babies.
