Pastor's Corner "In a loud voice she exclaimed: 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear!"

Luke 1:42 (NIV)

In the above verse, Elizabeth's greeting to Mary was a spontaneous expression of bursting joy and gratitude, for in her young cousin she saw the handiwork of God, and on her face she saw the unmistakable signs of trusting faith. Mary was God's favored one, a chosen instrument to help bring about God's work of salvation. But Mary was also hardly more than a girl, one of countless Jewish girls whose simple lives were lived in the homes and villages of Palestine. There was nothing unique, nothing profound about her, she was really quite ordinary. Just the sort of "earthen vessel" through which God often works out God's most amazing miracles.

Among the other wonders of Christmas, we remember today that God does not bypass even the weaknesses of human frailty in order to work out God's plan. In fact, the message of the incarnation is that it is often precisely through mere human beings that God reveals the Almighty's splendor! This is a day to rejoice, for no person is despised by God, no person is useless in God's hands, no person is too flawed to be blessed by God!

Only one thing was required of Mary in order that she might bear the Son of God, her willingness to believe. Mary believed in the goodness, the love, and the power of God. No super-human strength was required, no extraordinary amount of faith. God sent the angel Gabriel to one who listened to God's call and answer with those simple words from Luke 1:38, "May it be to me as you have said!" And shouldn't that be our answer to God's call on our life as we seek to do God's work in our community? Shouldn't "We trust God's Spirit to work in us, through our words and deeds, wherever we are?" We can if we, like Mary, only believe! So this Christmas let us greet the God who came directly into our midst to save us, with the same joy and gratitude as Mary, and may our hearts be lifted by the remembrance that God used one just like us to introduce God's Son to the World!


